

## Reading tasks –

Read as many books as you can during the time away from school. Try to read from a variety of genres (fiction, non-fiction, newspapers, comics, recipes, poems etc).

Write a book review for 4 different books. Your review should include the following:

- A quick overview of what the text is about
- A review of the main character – including a description
- What you liked about the text
- What you didn't enjoy about the text
- What audience would most like the text and why

## Writing tasks –

1) Write a film review for at least 3 different films.

Your review should include the following:

- A quick overview of what the film is about
- A review of the main character – including a description (appearance and behaviour)
- What you liked about the film
- What you didn't enjoy about the film
- What audience would most like the film and why
- Comparison between the films

2) A report on your favourite dinosaur to include:

Details of notes from research conducted in books (note which ones), websites (note which ones)

- A plan of what to include in each section of the report
- A first draft of the report which has then been edited in a different colour
- A published final draft to include all the changes made with the edits

HINT – remember the non-fiction report sections that have been taught (Title, introduction, subheadings, fun fact box, formal and technical language etc)

3) Adventure story:

Write an adventure story to follow on from this starter. This project is to include:

- A story map style plan of what to write about (starter, build up, problem, resolution)
- A description and drawing of a good character and a bad character (include appearance and behaviour)
- A first draft of the story (extended piece of writing)
