Art: How many different ways can you represent love? You could also draw/paint/collage a picture of your family/ friends and don't forget your pets if you have any!




Writing:

If you have story cubes you could use them or the dice method. Roll a dice to discover the subject of your headline - who is doing something in the story. Use the number code to find your subject or create your own: 1=The Queen 2 = Little Red Riding Hood 3 = Mrs Savage 4= David Beckham 5= Friend 6 = Elephant. Roll the dice again to discover the verb of your headline - the action. Use the number code to find your verb or create your own: 1=Discovers 2=Hides 3= Eats 4=Sells 5=Steals 6 =Chases. Roll the dice again to discover the object of your headlining -who or what it is happening to. Use the number code to find your object or use your own: 1=Monkey 2=Donuts 3= Kangaroo 4= Fried chicken 5= Slime 6= Your teacher. Finally, put your subject, verb and object words together to create your news headline to create a story.

Poetry: You could write an acrostic poem with 'LOVE' written down the side.

How many words can you find that rhyme with love or heart? Can you use these to write your own poem about love?



Science:

You could make a fact file about the heart.

Fizzy heart experiment:

Materials: Plate/ tray, baking soda, glitter, vinegar, pipette/ teaspoon, heart cookie/play-doh cutter or use hands to mould a heart shape.

Method: Place the heart shaped cutter on a plate/tray and fill with baking soda. Then sprinkle some glitter on top. Using the pipette or teaspoon drop the vinegar onto the baking soda. What do you see, hear, smell?

Maths:

"How do I love thee? Let me count the ways". This week's maths challenge is to practice your times tables and your speed addition and subtraction. You can find some worksheets for all levels to help you at <http://www.snappymaths.com/>

A love heart is symmetrical; you could design a symmetrical pattern or paint a pattern on one side and fold it over to reveal a symmetrical pattern. You could design your own 'snake and ladders' type game including things that you love e.g. football, rainbows etc.



Motor skills:

Get creative with some heart shaped activities that uses fine motor skills.



Music:

You could write your own song/ rhyme about love. It could be a love of sport, love for your pet, love for the world, your friends etc. Can you make a dance routine to go with your song/rhyme or play an instrument? You could perform it to someone special.

Geography:

Show 'Love for the Earth', for example: collect recyclable items to make a bird feeder, plant flowers, fruits, vegetables and/or trees. Can you make your home more eco-friendly?

Below tells us many things that love is not. Draw a cartoon strip to show what love is.
